Under the Hood

LICENSE PLATE RESTORATION

Disclaimer: I am not a license plate guy.

However, when a couple of really rough license plate presented themselves at the 2022 Portland Swap Meet at bargain prices, they found their way home for our 1915 and 1919 Model T Fords. A couple of interesting things to note about 1915 Oregon licenses plates are: 1) They are de-bossed. That is, the numbers and letters are not raised; they are stamped down, or recessed into the plate. 2) The license plates were tin plated before they were painted. 3) The background paint (yellow) is only on the raised areas. The black paint on the debossed area was painted directly onto the tin plating. When the old paint was removed, there was no evidence of yellow paint under the black numbers and letters.

One would think that tin plating before painting would help to prevent rust, but these 107 year old plates were very rusty nevertheless. Paint was stripped away, and rust was removed. A significant amount of "spot putty" was required to fill in the rust pits followed by numerous exercises of paint primer, sand, repeat...

Undoubtedly, there are specific color codes for specific years for license plates but basically, 1915 license plates are yellow with black lettering, and 1919 license plates are orange with black lettering. Suitable colors of yellow and orange in the finest of quality rattle can paint were located from the big box store and paint step #1 was completed.

The paint shelf yielded a small can of black "One Shot Sign Painters' Lettering Enamel" that was left over from another project. One Shot Lettering Enamel flows very nicely, making it a favorite for pin stripers. All that was needed was to complete the license plate project was a selection of brushes - some wide brushes for wide areas, some small brushes for small areas. and some squared-off brushes for, well, squared-off areas. One advantage of license plate lettering and numbering is if you don't like your work, you can easily use paint thinner on a cloth to wipe it off and repaint what you didn't like. However, it seemed like I did that ... A LOT.

Deferring to my restoration friend, Mr. Google, I stumbled upon an incredible product: An oil-based paint pen made by a company called Craft Smart. Think of a Marks-a-lot chisel tip marker and a Sharpie permanent fine point marker, but delivering black oil-based paint. Cool, huh? A quick search of where I could find such a magical product led me 21/2 miles away from home to Michael's. Back at home, \$11.99 later, with a 3pack paint arsenal, I was ready to complete the project. The paint pens still take a steady hand, but they were much easier to work with than enamel paint and a brush.

I'm sure that any professional license plate restorer reading this would be screaming, "No, no, no... don't listen to anything this guy is telling you!" But the procedure and products outlined above worked for me.

An Anthropomorphic Tale by The Model T Ford Who Traveled From Wenatchee to Mexico (Part 3)

I am a 1921 Model T Ford Touring car telling my story.

One day I heard a strange knocking noise way down inside my engine. I don't remember the farmer putting oil in my engine for a long time and I wondered what was going to happen. The noise continued and in the fall I was parked behind the barn. Most of the winter I was covered with snow. During that time the water in my block froze but it did not crack because there was not much water in it. So I sat parked behind the barn for several years.

Finally one day the farm was sold and the people all moved away. The house was torn down but the barn was left standing. Someone came and took my frame and wheels away and left the rest of me in a pile behind the barn. There I was for many years abandoned and what paint was left on my metal slowly rusted away.

One cool fall day a new maroon 1967 Ford Victoria pulling a green open trailer stopped by the barn. Two men and three young boys got out, looked me over, and loaded all of my parts into the trailer. We went to several abandoned farms where they found other parts like mine and loaded them in the trailer with me. Three hours later they unloaded all of the parts from the trailer into an old garage in Puyallup near Tacoma.

I sat in the dark garage for several years which was a good thing because it was warm and dry and I stopped rusting away. During a hot day one summer a Silver 1978 Cadillac Seville pulling an orange U Haul trailer pulled up to the garage and the two men who found me at the farm loaded me and some of the other parts into the trailer. Three days later I was unloaded into a storage shed behind a home in Chula Vista.

A year later I was transferred to a storage garage on Main St. in Chula Vista. Six months later I was moved to a home with a large garage in Chula Vista. As I did not have a frame my new owner bought one at a swap meet from a man who came from Arizona. The frame was cracked on the right side and had several loose rivets in the front.
